

Roman Civilization

The Romans developed a civilization as well as an empire. Roman achievements in government, law, language, and the arts are still important today.



The Romans were not interested in pure math as the Greeks were. Romans used mathematics for more practical matters, such as building roads, bridges, and temples out of stone, keeping accounts, and supplying their armies. People used the Roman numbering system, Roman numerals, long after the Roman Empire fell. They are still sometimes used today. Look at the credits of your favorite movie. You must be able to decipher Roman numerals to know what year the movie was made.

Life in Ancient Rome

- Roman art, literature, and science borrowed much from the Greeks.
- Roman engineers made advances, including the development of cement, the arch, aqueducts, and domes.
- Religion and family were important parts of Roman life.

The Fall of Rome

- A series of weak emperors, invasions by outsiders, disease, and a number of other factors led to a greatly weakened Roman Empire.
- Numerous invasions by Germanic peoples led to the fall of Rome in A.D. 476.
- Rome passed on many achievements in government, law, language, and the arts.

The Byzantine Empire

- The Byzantine, or Eastern Roman Empire, grew powerful and wealthy as the Western Roman Empire fell.
- The Byzantine capital was at Constantinople and was heavily influenced by Greece.
- The Byzantine emperor, Justinian, reconquered much of the land that had been held by the old Roman Empire in the Mediterranean.
- Justinian also issued a new law code known as the Justinian Code. This reform made the empire's laws easier to understand by individuals and have had a great influence on the laws of almost every country in Europe.
- The Byzantines developed a rich culture based on Roman, Greek, and Christian ideas. The empire grew wealthy from trade, and art, architecture, and education flourished.
